In "The Letter," dramatic irony reveals the postmaster's initial dismissal of Ali's pain, only to empathize after his own daughter's distress. While "Ozymandias" uses irony to critique hubris, "The Letter" employs it to highlight empathy's value, both emphasizing human limitations through contrasting lenses.

2. How does Elsie Brown use humour in "A Shady Plot" to explore the conflict between creativity and external pressures?

Answer: Elsie Brown uses humour in "A Shady Plot" through the ghost Helen's sarcastic interactions and John's comical struggles to write ghost stories under pressure. Helen's complaints about overworked ghosts humorously reflect John's creative block, highlighting how external demands, like Lavinia's expectations, stifle creativity, resolved when Helen inspires him.
