- II. When John says a ghost taking shape is like watching a moving picture cartoon being put together, it means the ghost forms gradually, like images in a cartoon. The writer uses this simile to describe the sudden way the ghost appears.
- III. In Shakespeare's Sonnet 55 and Shelley's "Ozymandias," time proves more powerful than marble and monuments. Both poets emphasize that physical structures erode with time, while poetry and words endure, preserving memory beyond the reach of temporal decay.
- IV. Patol Babu suggested to Mr. Mullick that the scene may work better if he was holding an open newspaper and the collision happened while his eyes were on the article.

In Act 3, Scene 1 of *Julius Caesar*, betrayal is most evident in Brutus' participation in Caesar's assassination. Caesar's shock at Brutus' betrayal, captured in his famous line "Et tu, Brute?", underscores the depth of his emotional wound. Caesar trusted Brutus, but Brutus justifies his actions as being for Rome's greater good, showing how betrayal can be rationalized by the betrayer but devastating for the betrayed. The betrayal leads to chaos and civil strife in Rome.

In Vikram Seth's *The Frog and the Nightingale*, the frog manipulates the nightingale, exploiting her talent for personal gain. The nightingale's trust is betrayed, leading to her exhaustion and eventual death. The frog, driven by jealousy, remains unaffected by her demise. Both works show betrayal as a destructive force: it harms the innocent while benefiting the betrayer only temporarily, and it ultimately leads to loss, either of life or stability.

II. In Dear Departed by Stanley Houghton, familial relationships are marked by self-interest and neglect. The siblings, Amelia and Elizabeth, exhibit a superficial concern for their deceased father, Abel Merryweather, focusing instead on his possessions. Their interactions reveal a lack of genuine love and respect, emphasizing how materialism can overshadow familial duty.

It is a story of two selfless, sincere and young boys and of their hardships that they face for the medical treatment of their sister. She is suffering from tuberculosis. The story is attention-grabbing. It emphasizes the importance of selfless love and sacrifices that keep a relationship strong. In other words, it says that these two attributes are vital for humanity.
